notes: The fruit was handpicked from our homefarm vineyard mid~October 2019. The vintage was marked by a rainy spring and a cool growing season. A six varietal field blend, the fruit was foot crushed and pressed immediately to co~ferment with native yeast after a day of wholecluster fermentation. After about two weeks of continuous fermentation, the wine was bottled to finish under cap as a pétillant naturel. No sulfur or other additions.

A true wine of the garden, the House Music is grown at our homefarm in the mountains, nestled between orchard and vegetable garden, the two intermingling, along with roses and wildflowers.

Reminiscent of a very dry lambrusco, the fruit is fresh and bright, excellent acidity pairs well with cured meats, pâtés, anything with fat, and is a lively alternative to serve with duck confit, choucroute garnis, or raclette.
